





FIRST PEOPLE: PEG LOGAN

Peg Logan's 100th birthday is Aug. 26! You'll want to celebrate her as much as we do by getting to know her life.

Peg was the editor of her high school newspaper in Lyndhurst, Ohio, and went to Miami University to be a journalist. She was a serious journalist; she never would have conceived of being a nurse. However, after her second year, Peg recalls having a dreamlike vision of hearing a friend talking about becoming a nurse. Then she heard a voice tell her very clearly, "That's what I want you to do." With determination fueled by this revelation, she set her mind to share her decision to pursue nursing. Her parents' elation surprised her, as they were already convinced of her innate nursing spirit.

Applying to St. Luke's Independent Hospital and Nursing School in Cleveland, Peg was admitted having never taken a chemistry course. With her academic record, she was told, "Don't worry about it," and she was encouraged to participate in the U.S. Cadet Nurse Corps while pursuing her nurse's training. This program provided tuition and a stipend to recruits during a time of a nursing shortage during World War II. This decision to pursue nursing relieved her family of the burden of paying for any college degree and provided all Peg needed to live on, close to home. Peg has had a long career as a nurse, eventually working in the cardiac care unit at Flower Hospital in Sylvania, and volunteering for 27 years at St. Luke's. Her daughter, Barb, worked for years in the intensive care unit also at Flower.

Peg was first introduced to her husband during her nurse's training while working at Cook County Hospital in Chicago. Her friend and fellow nurse was writing a letter to her fella serving in the war. She encouraged Peg to write to her friend, Pat, soon and often, because he didn't have a big family to write to him. Peg and Pat exchanged letters between Chicago and the Aleutian Islands for about a year. When he was relieved from action and took his leave, he flew into Chicago. Peg says when she saw Pat walking off the plane, she knew he was the one she would marry. "It was like we knew each other forever." They were engaged a couple of weeks later and married after months of getting to know one another during weekend visits while he was stationed at Ben Harrison Camp, Indianapolis, and she had returned to Mentor, Ohio.

Eventually, Pat and Peg moved to Perrysburg, and then to Archbold. They had three boys and one girl, our own Barb Sanford. Pat is now deceased, and Peg has 10 very busy grandchildren and 19 greats.

Peg has a quick wit and fascinating knowledge of changes in medicine over the decades. Take time to go for a visit. She will tell you to make lots of good friends, and at the start of each day rejoice and be glad. This is the day the Lord has made!

AUGUST NURSERY/PRESCHOOL THEME:


Preschool Monthly Overview:
